Report on Financial Statements

Notes on Financial Statements for the Year ended 31st March, 2021

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in India (Indian GAAP). The financial statements have been prepared to comply in all material respects with the accounting standards notified under the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006, (as amended and as applicable from time to time) and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013. The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and under the historical cost convention on Going Concern basis.

1.2 PRESENTATION AND DISCLOSURE OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

During the year ended 31 March 2019, the Schedule III notified under the Companies Act, 2013, has become applicable to the Company, for preparation and presentation of its financial statements. The adoption of Schedule III does not impactrecognition and measurement principles followed for preparation of these financial statements. However, it has significant impacton presentation and disclosures made in the financial statements.

1.3 USE OF ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the results of operations during the reporting period.

Although these estimates are based upon management's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from these estimates. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognised in the period in which the results are known / materialised.

1.4 FIXED ASSETS

Tangible Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment loss if any. While arriving at the historical cost, all costs, including net charges on foreign exchange contracts and adjustments arising from exchange rate variations attributable to the fixed assets, and including financing costs till commencement of commercial production or the date the asset is put to use or bringing the asset to its working condition for intended use, are capitalized.

1.5 EXPENSES INCURRED DURING CONSTRUCTION PERIOD

The progress / milestone based payments made under the contracts for projects and assets under construction or development and other capital advances are considered as advances on capital account until the same are allocated to fixed assets, capital work-in-progress, and expenditure during construction and other relevant accounts, as applicable.

Expenditure incidental to the construction of projects or assets under construction or development that take substantial period of time to get ready for their intended use is accumulated as expenditure during construction, pending allocation to fixed assets and other relevant accounts, as applicable.

1.6 DEPRECIATION & AMORTISATION

Depreciation on fixed assets is provided as per straight line method. Depreciation is computed as per Part "C" of Schedule II of The Companies Act 2013.

Depreciation on additions / deductions to fixed assets made during the year is provided on a pro-rata basis from / up to the date of such additions / deductions, as the case may be.

Intangible assets are amortized over the best estimate of their useful lives; subject to a rebuttable presumption that such useful lives will not exceed ten years.

1.7 GOVERNMENT GRANTS AND SUBSIDIES

Grantsand subsidies from the government are recognized when there is reasonable assurance that the grant/subsidy will be received and all attaching conditions will be complied with. When the grant or subsidy relates to an expense item, it is recognized as income over the periods necessary to match them on a systematic basis to the costs, which it is intended to compensate.

1.8 BORROWING COST

Borrowing costs directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of an asset that necessarily takes a substantialperiod of time to get ready for its intended use or sale are capitalized as part of the cost of the respective asset. All other borrowingcosts are expensed in the period they occur. Borrowing costs consist of interest and other costs that an entity incurs in connectionwith the borrowing of funds.

1.9 PROVISIONS

A provision is recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of a past event and it is probable that an outflow of resourcesembodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of obligation.

1.10 EARNINGS PER SHARE

Basic earnings per share are calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders (afterdeducting preference dividends and attributable taxes) by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during theperiod. Partly paid equity sharetreated as a fraction of an equity share to the extent that they were entitled to participate individends relative to a fully paid equity share during the reporting period. The weighted average number of equity shares outstandingduring the period is adjusted for events of bonus issue, bonus element in a rights issue to existing shareholders, share split, andreverse share split (consolidation of shares).

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders and theweighted average number of shares outstanding during the period are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

Current investments are carried at lower of cost and quoted/fair value, computed category wise. Long TermInvestments are stated at cost. Provision for diminution in the value of long-term investments is made only if sucha decline is other than temporary. Any loss or gain on sale / redemption of investments is recognized in the profit and loss account.
